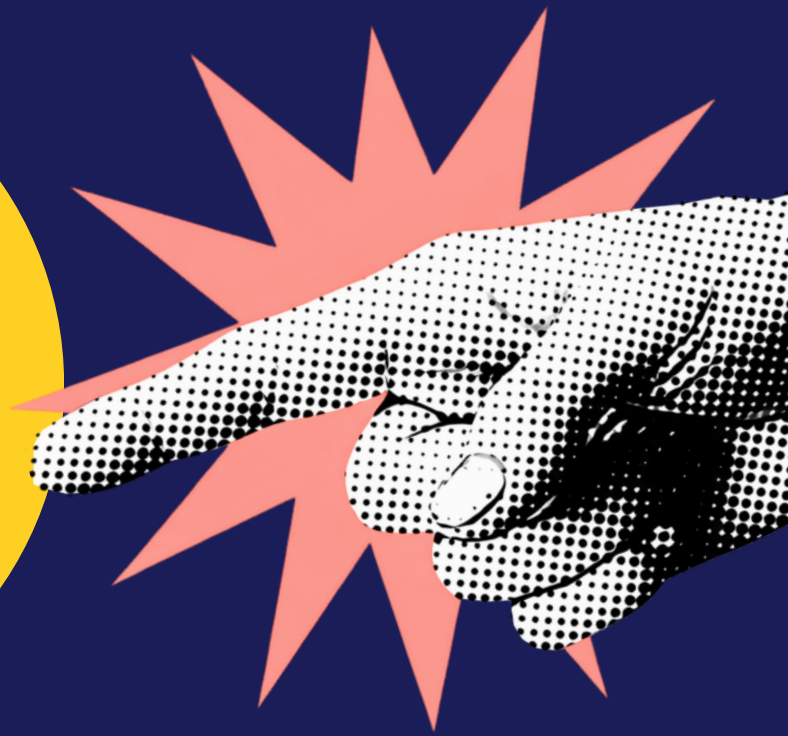
1.	Introduction to the project, objectives of the ToT and participant expectations.
